Volunteer Centre Outreach Services!

Volunteer Centre Tonbridge has extended its services to open new 'drop-in' centres in Snodland and Borough Green to provide help and advice to people wanting to become volunteers.

The new services, which are free to use, operate every first and third Wednesday morning between 10.30 and 12.30 in the Snodland Library and every second and fourth Wednesday morning between 10.30 and 12.30 in Borough Green Village Hall

They take the form of an informal meeting point where people can call in to discuss volunteering opportunities with one of the volunteer centre managers. This is a chance to explore volunteer roles in local community and voluntary organisations. Potential volunteers will be able to arrange more formal private interviews as required.

The primary role of a volunteer centre is promoting and supporting volunteering and providing a brokerage service recruiting volunteers for voluntary and community organisations. Each year the Tonbridge centre deals with several hundred enquiries from people wanting to offer their time and skills as a volunteer, and actively recruits volunteers for more than 100 organisations. Any voluntary or community organisation seeking volunteers in Snodland or Borough Green is invited to register with the volunteer centre, as are people who are wanting to work with these organisations in a volunteer role.

In Tonbridge, some people visit the volunteer centre office; others make contact by email or through the website www.do-it.org.uk. It is hoped that the new centres will provide the opportunity for prospective volunteers from that area to meet the volunteer centre staff informally. See our websites for more details. Other forms of communication remain available for those people unable to visit the outreach centres.

1st Ightham Scout Group

Caretaker/facilities/equipment manager

We are looking for someone to help look after our equipment, buildings and field in order to enable Ightham Scout Group to offer exciting opportunities to young people. You will be responsible, in consultation with the Group Leaders, to look after the Scout Group's building, field, trailers and boats.

Although, principally there will be no young person contact (as the tasks will need to be carried out on the whole when young people are not meeting) you will gain the satisfaction that you are helping a very popular Scout Group give the most we can to the young people of Ightham and the surrounding area.

No particular skills are required, although some skill with basic DIY tasks and the enjoyment of working outdoors and indoors are essential

3 H Fund (Help the Handicapped Holiday Fund)

Volunteer Nurse

A volunteer nurse is needed to be part of a holiday group of disabled people with volunteer carers and two experienced leaders. The disabled guests will require varying levels of nursing care. Duties will include being aware of medication that the disabled guests are taking and their possible side effects, renewing dressings and dealing with catheter care. They also need to advise holiday leaders of any health matter relating to the guests and determine any action that needs to be taken.

Volunteer Carers

Volunteer Carers are an essential part of the holiday group consisting of disabled people, a qualified nurse (also a volunteer) and two experienced leaders who offer support and give advice to the other volunteers. He/she will travel with the group to the holiday venue, stay the week at the venue caring for a disabled person and assisting that person on group outings.

Breast Cancer Campaign

Regional Volunteer

Volunteers are needed across the UK to raise awareness and funds in their local community. You can choose a volunteer role to suit your interests and availability, as part of a regional group, helping at local and national events or organising an event of your own. So if you would like to help in researching the cure for breast cancer and have skills and spare time, then Breast Cancer Campaign has a role for you.

British Trust For Conservation Volunteers

Compost Adviser

The Compost Adviser Project aims to appoint volunteers who will give advice to people who wish to start composting or may have encountered problems.

British Trust For Conservation Volunteers

Conservation Work

Practical work (woodlands, ponds etc.) with local groups across the county is needed. Also administration, tools maintenance & work in the office. This is a time flexible opportunity.

Kent Tree Warden

Play a valuable role in caring for trees in your local area. Free training courses available.

C S V - Time2Give

Time2Give

Working with local library service, volunteers assist with a variety of projects in their local libraries. Activities could include homework clubs, training in IT, meeting and greeting users, local history, reading and story telling.



Computer Buddies/Web Wizards

This activity is one of a series of volunteering opportunities with Kent Libraries and Archives to enrich and enhance Library services. With staff guidance the volunteer will be a buddy and help customers with software packages and provide basic technical support (such as help with paper jams). They will also help customers understand how the internet works and how to navigate it (library staff will deal with the specific information queries). Other tasks include helping customers set up email accounts and assisting library staff with occasional ICT taster sessions. Volunteers who are interested in genealogy can also help customers with ancestry.com.

Home Library Service

Volunteers deliver books to library customers and their carers who are housebound.

C.R.O.P. (Citizens Rights for Older People)

Advocate for Older People

The volunteer is needed to visit older people in their own homes and help them with claiming benefits, budgeting, completing forms, and setting up direct debit systems. Help is also needed with consumer and benefit problems.

Carers First

Trustees

Carers First supports carers in West Kent through information, support, advice advocacy and respite. The Board of Trustees are responsible for governance, strategy and ensuring the appropriate policies and financial controls are in place. Trustees from a wide range of different backgrounds are welcomed. The Board meets six times a year in a morning.

Brighter Days Befriender

Volunteer Befrienders visit an older person (usually in their home) on a regular basis to offer one-to-one support and companionship.

Each Befriending relationship is unique reflecting the personalities, interests, needs and strengths of the two people involved. They may want to encourage activities like Board games /Scrabble /Computer work/ letter writing or simply having a chat and a cup of tea, whatever they would mutually enjoy participating in.

The Befriender may also help with shopping, assist and escort the older person on medical / social appointments, or accompany them on a walk or outing. There is no personal care or lifting involved in this role.

The time commitment would be tailored to the client's and befriender's convenience and availability. The service is for people over the age of 60 and the majority of our clients do prefer afternoons or evenings.

Care Support

Volunteers are needed to provide support, advice and information for carers and to take part in the 'Sitting Scheme' which gives carers a short break. Time required is 4 - 5 hours weekly on a regular basis. Extra volunteers are required to help us expand our range of activities and respite groups.

Support Group Volunteer

Supporting Carers First staff in our support groups which include young carers and adult support groups (adult support groups are varied but include mental health, parents of children with autism, eating disorders etc.) The time commitment is monthly or fortnightly, to be arranged between the support group and the volunteer. Groups are held at our address in Tonbridge or Sevenoaks.



Citizens Advice Bureau

Advisers

Volunteers are needed to become CAB advisers to meet the increased need in the Borough. Volunteers will help people with diverse problems in areas such as housing, employment, benefits and debt.

Opportunities are available to work from the Tonbridge Bureau and at our outreach locations in the North of the Borough; currently at Kings Hill, Snodland and East Malling.

Demelza Hospice Care for Children

Community Volunteers to Support Children's Hospice

The role covers various tasks such as helping to set up and man stalls at events; helping with street collections; or anyone happy to find shops who are willing to have collection boxes. We are also looking for ambassador volunteers who are willing to give talks to schools, clubs and societies and do cheque presentations.

Home-Start South West Kent

Home Visitor

Volunteers who are parents themselves are needed to offer practical and emotional support to families in their own homes. This is a satisfying and enjoyable opportunity, with ongoing training and social meetings too. We are looking for people who can commit 2 -3 hours per week for at least one year from the end of training.

Trustees

Trustees - volunteers with a variety of experience are required to help support and shape the future of this vibrant charity working in the local communities across South West Kent. Meetings are held bi-monthly on a Tuesday from 10.00 to 12.00.

Kent Air Ambulance Trust

Air Ambulance Supporter

Volunteers are needed to support the service by manning a promotional stall at local events or emptying and placing collecting boxes.

Speaker

Are you a retired professional with a little time to spare? The Kent Air Ambulance Trust is looking for gifted communicators to give talks and receive cheques on their behalf throughout West Kent.

Every year the charity has invitations to attend hundreds of events and present its work; these can be anything from school assemblies to Rotary dinners. Although some experience in public speaking is desirable, all the necessary background information about the Air Ambulance will be given in informal training sessions at the charity's operational base in Marden.

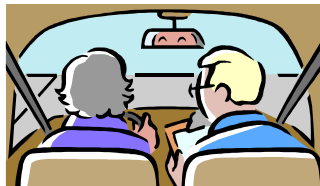
Kent Association For The Blind

Befriender

Volunteers are needed for befriending, visiting or escorting blind or partially sighted people, a knowledge of sight impairment would be helpful, but empathy is essential. This is a time flexible opportunity.

Driver

Can you imagine life without your car? Not even being able to read a bus number. That's how isolated a visually impaired person feels. Could you help by becoming a driver for us and helping visually impaired people access clubs and activities?



Kent Cancer Trust

Help Us Conquer Cancer in Kent

We are seeking volunteers across Kent, who will operate within their 'home' area, identifying fundraising opportunities and areas where we can communicate the aims of the charity. It may involve visiting local retailers, schools, hospitals, clubs etc.; plus helping maintain contacts with local media.

Kent County Scout Council

Scout Leaders & Supporters

Volunteers over the age of 18 are required to help the Scout movement with a range of tasks. They include: working directly with young people as scout leaders, help on committees, fund-raising, administration, or helping with technical or personal support. There is also a young leaders scheme for young people aged 14 to 18 years.

Kent Foundation

Project Co-ordinator - Kent Enterprise Dinner

To organise a 'dinner' at which potential young entrepreneurs would make a 'pitch' for support from experienced business people for a range of 'in kind' support e.g. free consultation re marketing or legal advice during the business's formative months.

Work base is Maidstone but some home working is possible when appropriate. Young people to be recruited and trained as to how to make the most of their opportunity - eg. presentation skills Experienced business people to be recruited. Support to be monitored for effectiveness to young entrepreneur.

Kent Police

Volunteers with Kent Police

Support your community by volunteering for Kent Police at your local police station. There are a range of opportunities available including administration, IT work, customer service, or practical activities such as helping on Satellite front counters or with Neighbourhood Watch. This is a time flexible opportunity.

Kent Probation Area Mentor Unit

Mentors - 'Would you like to make a difference?'

Volunteer mentors can become involved in helping people into work, assisting with literacy and numeracy needs, housing problems or debt advice. A mentor needs to be non-judgmental and an empathetic listener with the ability to pass on life skills. Is this a role you could play?

Kent Wildlife Trust

Conservation of Kent's Wildlife

Kent Wildlife Trust is looking for volunteers to help with a range of tasks such as practical conservation work; livestock checking; people to help with school projects; visitor centre volunteers at Sevenoaks and Reculver and also Hides and trails guides in Sevenoaks. Also there is a vacancy for an education volunteer for Bough Beech (near Edenbridge), Sevenoaks and Tyland Barn.

Leukaemia CARE

Awareness Volunteer

We are looking for people who can raise awareness of Leukaemia CARE in their own local area by delivering our publications, posters etc. to GP surgeries, Libraries, Sports Centres etc.

CARE Volunteer

CARE Volunteers provide emotional support to those affected by Leukaemia, Lymphoma and the allied blood disorders, particularly to those who have contacted our 24hr CARE Line. You will be a listening ear, someone they can open up to in times of need who will help empower them to get through difficult times. Sometimes that support will be provided by telephone; sometimes it may be on a face to face basis in the caller's home or at the hospital. CARE Volunteers also work to raise awareness of Leukaemia CARE and provide information to patients, carers and medical professionals with regard to the services offered by the charity. Care Volunteers are also expected to arrange two small fundraising events each year such as coffee mornings; pub quizzes etc.

Fundraiser Volunteer

Are you someone who always goes that extra mile? Whatever level of responsibility you are looking for, whether it's to fundraise locally, organise events, take on adrenalin-filled challenges or co-ordinate regional fundraising you can get involved with Leukaemia CARE in activities to suit you. It could be baking cakes, organising big events or project managing. Local Fundraisers would spread awareness of Leukaemia CARE and carry out such duties as: - Maintenance of collection cans and banking of monies; Distribution of posters or promotional material; Selling annual draw tickets; - Distributing and co-ordinating Christmas Card brochures.

General Help

Wanted! - tea bar helpers, library assistants, clerical help - if you would like to offer your help at one of our local hospitals this opportunity could be for you! Time Flexible.

Ward Volunteer

Ward volunteers are needed for the neuro rehabilitation unit and for Accident and Emergency. In neuro rehabilitation we are looking for volunteers who can help with activities which stimulate the patients, such as playing games, doing crafts or just talking. Volunteers for the Accident and Emergency ward are needed to support the patients there, who may need practical help, such as someone to contact relatives or friends, maybe arrange for their pets to be cared for, find out information for them from hospital staff, or just be a shoulder to cry on.

Marie Curie Cancer Care

Daffodil Box Organiser

Volunteers are needed to organise and co-ordinate the local daffodil box campaign for the Great Daffodil Appeal in your local community. To recruit new sites to display boxes (eg. in shops), distribute and collect in the daffodil boxes and count, bank and record all monies from them. The volunteer would need to be involved from September to October for the planning and recruitment of sites and then February to April for delivery of boxes and collection of boxes.

Daffodil Collection Organiser

We are looking for volunteers to organise a local street or store collection for the Great Daffodil Appeal. This includes recruiting collectors, planning the rota, hosting the collection and banking the money collected. This role will be based in the local community. Involvement will be required between January to March and will take a minimum of 4 days to set up. Hours are flexible, except for collection day, of course!

Medix

First Aider

We are looking for volunteers to provide first aid and emergency care at events throughout Kent. Using our first aiders and NHS professionals the organisation provides anything from a first aider at a community event to a mobile hospital at large events such as the Hop Farm War and Peace Show. We are looking for anyone who has or wants to gain first aid or medical experience to join our dedicated and enthusiastic team of volunteers. If you already have a first aid qualification that's great, but if you don't and are prepared to commit to attending training and events we will pay for you to get a Health and Safety Executive First Aid at Work qualification. If you are an experienced driver you may be given the opportunity to drive our ambulances.

Medway Valley Countryside Partnership

Be part of the Riverside Communities

Volunteers are needed to help with the Riverside Communities Project. This project is based along the River Medway and focuses on the natural and industrial heritage of the River Medway, engaging with the local community through events, workshops, trails and information leaflets. Help is needed with the research into the history of the River Medway and collecting peoples memories of how the river used to be. There will also be help needed with events and practical footpath improvements.

River Warden

Do you want to be involved in the enhancement of your local countryside and community? If so then becoming a River Warden may be for you. Our wardens are the eyes and ears on the ground, reporting any problems such as fly tip, pollution or invasive non-native plants, removing unsightly litter, monitoring footpaths and recording wildlife. Due to this variety River Wardens play a vital role in the preservation of the River Medway plus it gives people a great opportunity to get out and about, walk the dog or just get some fresh air.

Practical Conservation Projects with the Thursday Action Group

Volunteers are required to help out on practical conservation projects with the Thursday Action Group. Typical projects: - hedge planting, fencing, wildlife garden creation and construction activities. No experience needed - training and tools provided (and tea & biscuits) Projects are based in Maidstone and Tonbridge and Malling. Wear old clothes, bring wellies, waterproofs, suncream and a packed lunch.

National Trust

Ightham Mote Room Stewards

The National Trust is looking for more week-end volunteer room stewards at Ightham Mote so if you feel at a 'loose end' during Saturdays and Sundays why not come along and spend some sociable time with the enthusiastic team of people who already welcome their visitors and ensure everybody has a memorable time. No experience necessary - they just need individuals who genuinely enjoy meeting people. If this sounds like the challenge you are looking for please get in touch.

Ightham Mote Learning Assistant

Ightham Mote currently needs new volunteers to join a team of Learning Assistants to help with the delivery of an ever growing education programme. This would appeal to people who enjoy the challenge of working with children and would therefore necessitate undergoing a Criminal Records Bureau check. The role would be to assist with the delivery of a guided tour of the house, followed by various activities both indoors and out.

Ightham Mote Conservation Exhibition Steward & Raffle Seller

We are looking for somebody who enjoys meeting people and dealing with the general public who would assist in ensuring that our visitors receive a warm welcome at the Visitor Reception & Conservation Exhibition at Ightham Mote and dealing with enquiries.

One-To-One Youth Befriending

Befriender/Mentors for Young People

An opportunity to act as a volunteer befriender/mentor to young people (6-16 years) at risk of isolation. This may involve visiting a young person offering support, be their friend and give them a little time at weekends, the school holidays or after school. Befriending makes a difference because the young person has a role model, someone they can rely on and trust. The young person gains self esteem and confidence. It gives a young person new interests. Volunteers have fun and know they are making a difference to the youngsters that they help. Times: Any day, evening or weekends, once a week, once a fortnight or whenever is convenient to you.

Prince's Trust

Progression Mentor

Do you have the ability to relate to young people and the commitment to help them overcome often considerable disadvantages? The 'Get Into' programmes offer young people the opportunity to develop practical skills and qualifications related to a specific sector or industry whilst at the same time encouraging them to build confidence, self esteem and achieve identified goals. As a mentor you will develop a meaningful relationship with the young person. You will offer support, encourage them to explore options and help them achieve success by working towards identified goals.

Volunteer Personal Mentors

As a Princes Trust Volunteer Mentor you'll encourage and assist a young person to plan and take steps towards achieving their personal goals with a view to moving them towards employment, training or education opportunities. By providing support, guidance and encouragement you can help them with their choices and directions. It is a challenging role and most of the young people we help are overcoming various disadvantages (ie. a record of offending, a life spent in care, long term unemployment, having no qualifications) and maybe lacking in key skills, confidence, plans and more.

R S P B

Wardening Schemes

There is an opportunity to work as a voluntary warden for up to four weeks at one of the 41 RSPB nature reserves throughout the UK. Longer placements are available by arrangement and availability. Work includes practical management tasks, working with visitors and help with survey work

RE Computer Recycling (Rochester)

IT Technicians

This role involves testing and refurbishing computer equipment. We are looking for people who will be flexible and willing to undertake training where needed. The work involves the carrying of computer equipment and helping to load and unload equipment, but allowances are made for those having medical conditions which prohibits lifting heavy items.

Remap

Skilled Volunteers

Remap is a nationwide organisation, primarily of engineers who provide solutions which are not commercially available, for people with disabilities.

Volunteers are required who are skilled in metalwork or woodwork, or with hands-on electronic experience, to work on technical equipment for disabled people.

Stepahead Support

Mentor

Stepahead Support, previously known as Moving Forward, has been providing support, opportunities and choices to vulnerable young people aged 16 - 25 since 1995. We support young people who are homeless, care-leavers, young offenders or having difficulties in their lives, moving them towards a positive future and fulfilling their aspirations.

The majority of our clients benefit from the support and advice of an adult mentor. Mentors may come from any background. Their varied skills and abilities and experience of life will help clients make the choices to build their future lives. Mentors essentially work alone with the clients, setting meetings to suit one another, within clear guidelines.

The Beat Project (Snodland)

Dance Dig and Diet Champion



After successfully completing an introductory training session, Dance, Dig and Diet Champions will join our Veg Bag distribution scheme, hence contributing to our broader agenda of promoting healthier life styles. They will build on their skills, knowledge and confidence to communicate effectively about healthier life styles and what people can do locally to improve their health through dance-fitness activities, gardening activities, and healthy diets.

DDD Champions will also have opportunities to attend a wide range of community events to engage with people about healthy living and help people take positive action.

As a volunteer you will carry out some or all of the following tasks depending on your individual capabilities and preferences. Undertake an introductory training course about the Dance, Dig and Diet program , and your role as a DDD champion.

Your main role : To receive deliveries of fruit and vegetables at the local point of distribution and to assist in sorting and bagging; To collect payments from customers; To serve customers; To ensure the session runs smoothly, e.g. setting up tables, taking orders for the following week; To place a weekly order with our fruit and vegetable suppliers.

The Cinnamon Trust

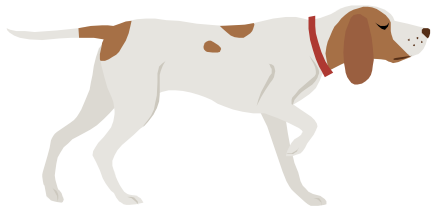
Animal Transporter

We are looking for volunteers to take animals to the vets etc. or possibly to transport them to a foster home.

Promotion of Animal Charity

We are looking for volunteers to help make people aware of the work of the trust. This involves putting up posters in vets surgeries, libraries, doctors surgeries etc. Contacting local hospitals, police stations, social services etc. and promote awareness of the work that we do.

Dog Walker



Volunteers are needed to walk dogs - picking the dog up from the owner, taking him/her for a walk and then returning the dog back to his/her owner.

This is not always a regular volunteering activity - volunteers who register with the Cinnamon Trust are invited to walk dogs as and when a client is living near to the volunteer.

The Kent Event Team

Kent Event Team Member

Kent Event Team members volunteer at a range of exciting events, locally and across the county, mostly in the areas of sport, culture, leisure and tourism. You will be kept informed of all the upcoming events you can get involved with, and if you are available to help, just let us know and we will put you in touch with the event organiser - it's simple and flexible.

Tonbridge & Malling Borough Council

Street Monitors

Street monitors are community minded volunteers and can be individuals or part of a group. They can report problems regarding the Street Scene services direct to our 'Streetline' number on 01732 87 60 60 or online at www.tmbc.gov.uk. The monitors are not asked to go out of their way to find problems, but simply report anything such as the build up of litter, graffiti and dog fouling that they notice during their day to day activities. Monitors can benefit from regular meetings and training.

Valley of Visions Landscape Partnership Scheme (Snodland)

Heritage Warden

Heritage wardens, will work as part of a network of all ages, throughout the Medway Gap, who will identify; record and monitor heritage assets in their area. Extensive free training will be provided to support this as well as a guidance pack. Members of the Valley of Visions Team and Kent County Council Heritage will also be available to assist with any queries and to help get you started.

Office Volunteer

We are looking for volunteers to assist the Valley of Visions Team with office tasks. Duties would include doing mail outs, answering phone calls, website updating, dealing with promotion and press releases and helping to organise events, training courses and conferences.

Promotion and Marketing co-ordinator

We are looking for a volunteer to co-ordinate the marketing and promotion of Valley of Visions. Duties would be to establish and maintain contacts with local press, write and distribute press releases, update the website, arrange press for events and regularly check local press for articles about Valley of Visions.

Public Rights of Way Warden

We are looking for a volunteer to survey the public rights of way within a parish within the Valley of Visions project area to identify path condition, issues, opportunities and improvement. Duties would be to undertake a regular (monthly) survey of the rights of way in a given parish. You would undertake simple repairs such as replacing PROW discs and cleaning interpretation panels. You would report issues and illegal access and fly-tipping and identify opportunities to create circular routes.



Victim Support

Witness Service Supporters

Witness service volunteers give support to witnesses by being someone to talk to (not about the evidence); by visiting the court centre; providing information on court procedure accompanying witnesses to court etc. Volunteers who can commit to give a minimum of one day (or two half days) to this service per fortnight, which will be based at the court.

Victim Support Community Volunteer

Victim support community volunteers contact victims of crime and offer emotional and practical support. The position might involve both telephone contact and home visits.

West Kent Mediation

Mediators

Volunteers are needed to train for mediation for neighbours/communities in dispute, and parent/teen mediation. The time commitment is flexible but we are looking for volunteers to undertake 4 community cases per year.

West Kent Mediation is a community based mediation service and offers a free, impartial and confidential mediation service to neighbours/communities in dispute throughout the West Kent area. They also offer a parent/teen mediation service which aims to improve relationships between teenagers and their parents/carers.

Mediation is a process in which an impartial third party helps disputing parties to work out an agreement, and it is generally recognised as being one of the most effective ways to solve such problems as noise, disagreements over children, verbal abuse and anti social behaviour, pets, parking etc.

West Kent Primary Care Trust

Health Network Member

The role involves reading occasional documents and telling us what you think of them and attending one of our meetings or discussion groups. You might also meet the key decision makers to share your views face to face and give your opinion by taking part in one of our surveys. It may also involve attending training courses to learn about some of the more complex issues in greater depth.

Young Lives Foundation

Kent Independent Visitors Service

Kent Independent Visitors Service provides Befrienders for a child in care. The job requires a weekly phone chat and two outings per month. A minimum two year commitment is requested. Time Flexible.

Now that you have seen some of the opportunities, we suggest that you list the ones of most interest to you. There may be only one or two, or there may be lots! We will normally make introductions to no more than three organisations in the first instance. If after discussing the voluntary work with the agencies seeking help, you feel that it is not something that you would want to pursue, then we will be happy to refer you to further organisations. We are always available to talk to you if you have any questions. We will contact you a few weeks after the introductions to see how you are getting on.

You will need to complete an application form, if you have not been sent one then you can telephone for a copy or email us. Alternatively you can download one from our websites
